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

Monday was Crazy Hair Day, Tuesday was Flannel Day, Wednesday was Spirit Day, and Thursday was Tie Dye Day. S.O.S. peer leaders promoted Strength based messages during advisory all week by helping teach lessons and lead activities. All HHS students were given the



opportunity to learn about the importance of having a trusted adult or mentor. They watched a video on bullying and what it takes to be a positive friend. Students discussed the eight strengths, and shared about the one that meant the most to them. S.O.S. president Nallely Gonzalez with a team of students organized a S.O.S. Carnival on Wednesday October 25th for spirit day with the goal of getting everyone



involved in healthy activities. The lunch period was extended so everyone could participate. Booths included, face painting, fishing for compliments, apple bobbing, an obstacle course, a tie dye station, sack races, basketball hoop shoot, a balloon game challenge...The National Guard came and set up a battle bots game and a strength measuring punching bag. Students who are considering the military, are encouraged to apply to at least one college. In order to apply to college's, student will need their social security number and need to know the exact spelling of their legal name. The Idaho State Board of Education through the Next Steps website has created an online application where seniors can apply to 8 Idaho colleges at once. AVID prepares students for 21st century careers each day by providing the academic and behavioral skills necessary to succeed in the workplace. Organization, time management, critical thinking, collaboration, and problem-solving are strong components of the AVID System. AVID includes career exploration in its secondary curriculum, develops partnerships with organizations to help students find [pathways to careers](#), and supports and prepares students in degree and certificate programs to be [successful in the workforce](#). For the 2017-18 school year, Homedale High School will have three AVID classes. One class for freshmen, sophomores and juniors.
