MAP Testing for 9th, 10th & 11th: Fall Test Dates September 5th-7th

Homedale High School will be MAP testing all 9th, 10th and 11th graders three times during the school year to assess their skills in math, English and reading. The data from this test will help Homedale High School administration and teachers determine where students are strong and what they need to work on to improve academically and what instructional changes need to be made to make this possible. This is not a federal or state mandated test but simply a skills assessment that the Homedale School District has put into place this year to help both students and teachers improve.
